

Kusama-Inspired Kaleidoscopes

Gather:

toilet paper roll, white paper, scissors, tape, measuring tape or ruler, markers, stickers, three pieces of reflective material



Step 1:

Cut paper to match the length of the toilet paper roll. Cut enough paper to wrap around the roll.

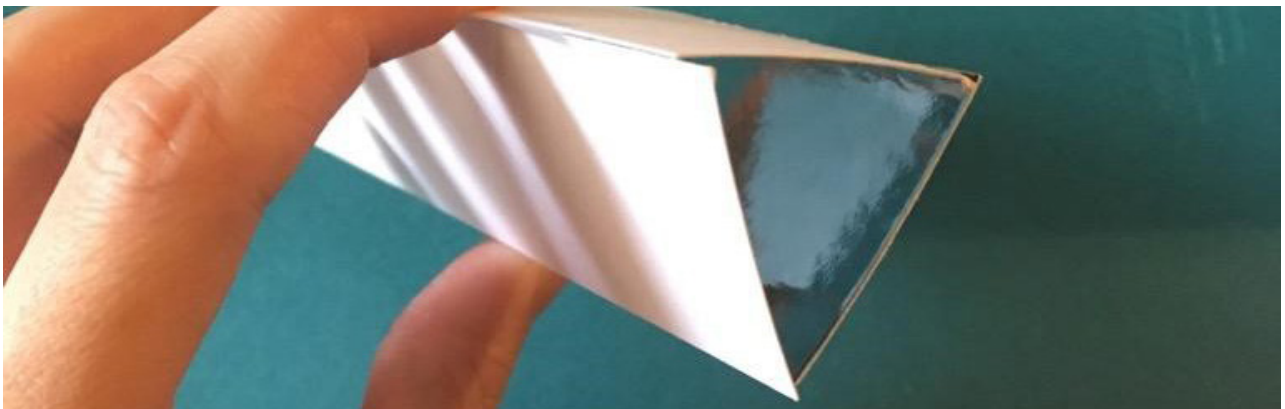
Cut three rectangular pieces of reflective materials, roughly the same length of the roll. Width should be 1 & 1/4 inches.

Step 2:

Decorate your white paper with polka dots, stickers - make it yours! Tape around roll.



Step 3: *Tape rectangles together to make triangle, with mirrored side facing in.*

Step 4:

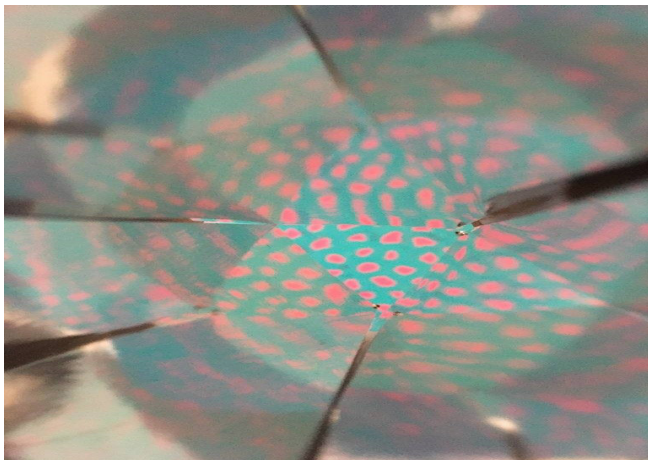
Insert triangular viewer into roll.

Use a rolled over piece of tape to secure the viewer to the roll.



Step 5:

Try out your kaleidoscope around the house or take it on your next neighborhood walk! As you look through the kaleidoscope, try twisting the tube and observe changes in movement, light, and color.



Do the repetitive patterns created by your kaleidoscope remind you of Kusama's work? What's similar? What's different?
